WHAT IS THE LITTLE SLEEPAWAY CAMP AT CAMP LA LLANADA ALL ABOUT?

LITTLE Sleepaway Camp at Camp La Llanada is specially designed for campers 7 to 12 years of age. This experience is a very important step in our Camper's Journey[™] where the development of independence and leadership at an early age are just some of the main objectives.

In this program, communication and cooperation among the members of the cabin are reinforced through activities that enhance their development and growth in a special and fun way. At LITTLE Sleepaway Camp we speak to our campers in their own language, as if we were in a real-life video game. They will collect tokens and gems, complete missions and #LevelUp as they succeed at

both personal and team challenges, always having the #LlanadaValues as basis.

LITTLE campers will have the opportunity to enjoy their independence surrounded by friends their own age and gradually develop their own abilities in a safe, controlled environment full of fun and fantasy

H What activities do campers do at LITTLE Sleepaway Camp?

At LITTLE Sleepaway Camp our activities are divided by worlds, in some they have to complete physical activities, in others more artistic activities, while in others more strategic activities. The goal of our campers is to conquer these worlds, challenging themselves and getting out of their comfort zone. And we have to mention our LITTLE campers' favorite world, the world of Lake Titicaca, where they spend their time tubing, blobbing, kayaking and much more.

Where is LITTLE Sleepaway Camp?

Our camp is located in the city of Sebring, FL, 3 hours from Miami and 2 and a half hours from Orlando. Here, we do plenty of outdoor activities and sleep in comfortable cabins with air conditioning and private bathrooms. Also, we enjoy our meals in a lake-front dining room and spend amazing times in all of the facilities this campsite has to offer.

E-J Is the camp in Spanish?

Our program is 100% in Spanish, although all of our counselors speak English if needed. All the activities, games and songs are carried out in Spanish, which motivates the campers to practice it in a fun way and without pressure. In addition, our program has the nature of highlighting the Latin traditions and culture through the charisma of our #StaffLlanada, the seasonal themes and our food that is super delicious, among many other things.



B4 What is a typical LITTLE Sleepaway Camp day like?

We get up around 8:00 am, have breakfast, do calisthenics and clean up our cabins. Then, we go to the morning activities, we spend time in the pool and after changing our clothes we have lunch and rest in our cabins. In the afternoon we have another block of activities, then we have a snack and go to the afternoon #LlanadaGame. After that we shower, have dinner and have another #LlanadaGame at night. We go to our cabins for the night around 10:00pm.



45 What do I have to bring to a LITTLE Sleepaway Camp session?

At camp we plan to be ourselves, to get dirty, to play in the rain, and for that we need you to wear clothes that you will not miss. The most important thing is that you do not pack anything of value. However, We have created for you a list of things that you cannot miss bring to the camp, You can print it from our APP and use it according to your needs. Therefore, Remember to request it through our Customer service by email or whatsapp.

What are the cabins like and how **b** do campers sleep?

Girls and boys sleep separately in cabins, each one of about 8 campers and 1 or 2 counselors, depending on the age of the campers. Campers sleeping in the same cabin will not have more than one year difference in age, to ensure that the experience is appropriate for them. The cabins have air conditioning, private bathroom and bunk beds.

How do I stay in the same cabin as a friend?

At camp you will meet many people and the most beautiful thing is to make new friends and get out of your comfort zone... that prepares us for a broader mentality and more adaptable life. If your friend is the same age or less than a year apart, it is possible that you stay in the same cabin, for this you must put their data in the Camper Form that is filled out a few months before to start the session [don't worry, we will notify you when it's time for you to fill it out]. However, we do not guarantee that we will be able to fulfill all requests and trust us, everything will be fine.



How do we get to camp?

We recommend that you take the bus directly to camp, since the experience starts from that moment on... You start to meet people, make friends and even learn the songs. Buses leave the Weston area on the first day of the session, between 8am and 11am [if you do not live in the Miami area, you can also get to camp on your own]. You can sign up for the bus service at the time of registration. We will send all the logistical details for that day before the start of the session.

Is there communication with the outside world during the LITTLE session?

You will receive all the information you need before and during the Temporada through our Camp La Llanada APP. There we also publish many photos daily and you can exchange digital letters with your campers.

You will receive instructions on how to download it at the time of registration.

What happens if we get homesick [and/or childsick]?

Preparation before summer is key for campers to have the best possible experience. Being able to participate in a full LITTLE Sleepaway Camp session, especially the first time, is an accomplishment that fills us with pride as campers and makes us feel strong. Dads and moms, reinforce the positive part of the experience and motivate them to achieve that feeling of satisfaction.

Feeling homesick [and/or childsick] during camp is normal and our team is strongly trained and prepared to help our campers and their parents to handle it in a collaborative way and with a lot of communication.
